MOST OF THE ARTWORKS DEPICTED THE DIRECT IMPACT OF CLIMATE CHANGE AND OTHER ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS ON WILDLIFE, BUT EVEN THE WORKS THAT DID NOT EXPRESSLY PICTURE ANIMALS ALL ADDRESSED THE NEGATIVE EFFECTS OF HUMAN INTERVENTION IN THE NATURAL WORLD. THIS EXHIBIT INCLUDED WORKS BY SEVERAL LIVING ARTISTS WHO HAVE NOT BEEN SHOWN AT THE MUSEUM PREVIOUSLY, AS WELL AS NEW WORKS BY ARTISTS ALREADY REPRESENTED IN THE MUSEUM'S PERMANENT COLLECTION.

THE 37TH ANNUAL WESTERN VISIONS ART SHOW + SALE WAS HELD ON SEPTEMBER 12, 2024. THE EXHIBITION WAS ON VIEW FROM SEPTEMBER 7TH THROUGH THE 29TH AND INCLUDED 173 ARTWORKS. FOR THE FIRST TIME THIS YEAR, THE KING GALLERY FEATURED 32 "LARGE FORMAT" PIECES, WHICH WERE CHOSEN BY WEIGHTED DRAW FROM AMONG THE ARTISTS SELECTED FOR THE SHOW. ALL OF THE WORKS WERE AVAILABLE ON THE NIGHT OF THE SALE VIA INTENT-TO-PURCHASE DRAW. ANY PIECES THAT WERE NOT ACQUIRED AT THAT TIME REMAINED AVAILABLE FOR PURCHASE THROUGHOUT THE DURATION OF THE EXHIBITION.

TONY FOSTER: WATERCOLOUR DIARIES FROM THE GREEN RIVER FEATURED 16 WATERCOLORS TRACING THE ARTIST'S JOURNEYS DOWN THE GREEN RIVER OVER A PERIOD OF MULTIPLE YEARS. THE EXHIBIT DEBUTED AT THE BUFFALO BILL CENTER OF THE WEST IN MAY OF 2023 AND WAS DEVELOPED THROUGH MULTIPLE COLLABORATIONS BETWEEN THE BBCW AND THE FOSTER MUSEUM IN PALO ALTO. ALL OF THE WATERCOLORS WERE PAINTED ON LOCATION, EN PLEIN AIR, AND EACH WAS ACCOMPANIED BY OBJECTS THAT FOSTER DESCRIBES AS "SOUVENIRS" OF HIS TRAVELS, SUCH AS FOSSILS, MAPS, AND ADDITIONAL DRAWINGS. THE EXHIBITION ALSO INCLUDED A VIDEO DESCRIBING HOW THIS PROJECT DEVELOPED AS WELL AS SOME OF THE TOOLS AND MATERIALS THAT THE ARTIST USED TO MAKE THESE WORKS. THIS SHOW WAS ON VIEW IN THE KING GALLERY BETWEEN OCTOBER 26, 2024 AND MAY 4, 2025.

THE FINAL EXHIBITION OF THE 2024 - 2025 FISCAL YEAR WAS OUT OF THE SHADOWS: PRINTS FROM THE PERMANENT COLLECTION, WHICH WAS ON DISPLAY IN THE CHANGING VISIONS AND BISON GALLERIES FROM NOVEMBER 2, 2024 UNTIL APRIL 27, 2025. THIS EXHIBIT EXPLORED HOW DIFFERENT TYPES OF PRINTS ARE MADE, AS WELL AS SOME OF THE MANY WAYS THAT PRINTED IMAGES HAVE BEEN PUT TO USE THROUGHOUT HISTORY. EACH OF THE 83 ARTWORKS SEEN HERE BELONG TO THE MUSEUM'S PERMANENT COLLECTION. AT LEAST 8 OF THE WORKS HAD NEVER BEEN DISPLAYED PREVIOUSLY. NO LESS THAN 10 DISTINCT PRINTMAKING TECHNIQUES WERE REPRESENTED, INCLUDING WOODBLOCK, WOOD ENGRAVING, ENGRAVING, DRYPOINT, ETCHING, LITHOGRAPH, LINO-CUT, SILKSCREEN, AQUATINT, AND MONOTYPE.

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS FOR CHILDREN - NMWA TYPICALLY SERVES CHILDREN THROUGHOUT THE REGION ANNUALLY, RANGING IN AGE FROM PRE-K TO GRADE 12. THIS YEAR WE SERVED 3,197 CHILDREN IN PERSON AND ANOTHER 422 OFF SITE DURING THE '24-'25 FISCAL YEAR. ONLINE OFFERINGS HAVE INCLUDED VIRTUAL GALLERY VISITS. THROUGHOUT THE YEAR WE USE OUR COLLECTION OF FINE ART TO TEACH A WIDE RANGE OF SUBJECT AREAS COMPATIBLE WITH SCHOOL CURRICULA. PROGRAMS FOR PRE-K THROUGH HIGH SCHOOL-AGE CHILDREN ARE FREE, OCCUR THROUGHOUT THE YEAR, AND ARE ADVERTISED ON OUR WEBSITE: [HTTPS://WWW.WILDLIFEART.ORG/LEARN/SCHOOL-PROGRAMS/](https://www.wildlifeart.org/learn/school-programs/)

OUR ANNUAL STATE OF THE ART: STUDENT ART SHOW IN HONOR OF MARION BUCHENROTH CONTINUED AS AN ANNUAL ON-SITE EVENT, MARCH 15, 2025 MAY 4, 2025. APPROXIMATELY 465 LOCAL CHILDREN GRADES K-12 CONTRIBUTED TO EXHIBITED ARTWORKS. FOR AN EIGHTH YEAR, LOCAL JACKSON HOLE HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS PARTICIPATED IN OUR "STUDENT CURATED EXHIBITION", JAN. 11 - MARCH 2. THE SELECTED THEME THIS YEAR WAS MYTHICS OF THE WEST. THE HONORS ART STUDENTS OF JACKSON HOLE WORKED COLLABORATIVELY WITH FELLOW STUDENTS IN OTHER CLASSES TO EXPLORE ANIMALS AND CULTURE. THEY COLLABORATED WITH A SPANISH CLASS IN THE CREATION OF LARGE-SCALE SCULPTURAL ALEBRIJES. THE EXHIBIT FEATURED PAPER MACHE SCULPTURES, DRAWINGS, PAINTINGS, AND MIXED MEDIA ARTWORKS INSPIRED BY THE THEME. STUDENT CURATORS LEARNED THE FUNDAMENTALS OF EXHIBIT CURATION INCLUDING SELECTING A THEME, REQUESTING ARTWORK FROM FELLOW STUDENTS, WRITING LABEL TEXT, AND HANGING THE EXHIBIT. FABLES, FEATHERS, AND FUR (FFF) IS OUR PROGRAM FOR PRE-K CHILDREN AND THEIR FAMILIES. IT CONTINUES TO DRAW APPROXIMATELY 15 PEOPLE PER SESSION. THE PROGRAM INCLUDES AGE-APPROPRIATE STORYTELLING AND ART MAKING. IN-PERSON COLLABORATIONS WITH TETON SCIENCE SCHOOL (TSS) DURING THE SCHOOL YEAR PROVIDE "ART AND SCIENCE" THEMATIC TOURS. PERFORMANCES AND ART-MAKING ACTIVITIES FOR FAMILIES WITH CHILDREN CONTINUED ON THE FIRST SUNDAY OF EACH MONTH FROM NOVEMBER THROUGH MARCH. OUTREACH PROGRAMS CONTINUED BOTH IN PERSON AND VIA ONLINE PLATFORMS. OUR ONLINE VIDEO OUTREACH PROGRAM CALLED BISONCAST FOR TEENS THROUGH ADULTS CONTINUED TO PROVIDE REMOTE ACCESS TO THE MUSEUM'S ART COLLECTION AND SURROUNDING ENVIRONMENT. TWO NEW EDUCATIONAL VIDEOS (WILD ABOUT ART, AND TREES OF LIFE) WERE FILMED DURING THE PAST FISCAL YEAR. EDITS WERE COMPLETED IN THE SUBSEQUENT FISCAL YEAR AND THE ADDITION OF SUBTITLES/CAPTIONS ARE STILL IN PROCESS. BOTH EPISODES WILL BE PUBLIC SOON. THESE EPISODES FEATURED THE MURAL ART OF GRETA GRETZINGER, AND THE BEAUTY AND ECOLOGICAL SIGNIFICANCE OF WHITEBARK PINE TREES. THE ART EXPLORATION FOOTAGE IS ALWAYS PAIRED WITH RELEVANT EXPLORATIONS INTO THE GREATER YELLOWSTONE ECOSYSTEM, INCLUDING THE BRIDGER TETON NATIONAL FOREST. OUR ON-SITE CHILDREN'S GALLERY PROVIDES HANDS-ON INTERACTIVE EXHIBITS FOR CHILDREN. A RANGE OF IN-GALLERY TECHNOLOGY-DRIVEN INTERACTIVES ARE MAINTAINED THROUGHOUT THE GALLERIES INCLUDING TWO 3D TACTILE DISPLAYS INFORMING VISITORS (ESPECIALLY BLIND AND LOW VISION VISITORS) ABOUT ROBERT BATEMAN'S POPULAR PAINTING OF A BISON, "CHIEF", AND GEORGIA O'KEEFFE'S "ANTELOPE".

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS FOR ADULTS WE SERVED 2,372 ADULTS ANNUALLY WITH OUR "SNEAK PEEK" GALLERY TALKS FOR NEW EXHIBITS, OUR FILMS, LECTURES, AND "MAKE IT WILD" STUDIO CLASSES. ANOTHER 1,137 ADULTS WERE SERVED BY VIRTUAL PROGRAMS SUCH AS BISONCAST AND RECORDED ART CLASSES. WE ALSO HAVE A RICH ROSTER OF COMMUNITY PROGRAMS ON THE OUTDOOR SCULPTURE TRAIL SUCH AS YOGA ON THE TRAIL AND SUMMER ART MAKING SUCH AS BOTANICAL

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SKETCHING AND PLEIN AIR WEAVING. WE CURRENTLY HAVE SEVEN FREE MOBILE TOURS AVAILABLE INCLUDING EXPLORING WILDLIFE ART, RUNGIUS LETTERS, SAVING A SPECIES, SCULPTURE TRAIL, THROUGH HER EYES, SENSORY IMMERSION TOUR (*NEW -FOR BLIND/LOW-VISION GUESTS), AND THE GREATER YELLOWSTONE BOTANICAL TOUR. AUDIO TOURS INCLUDE SPANISH LANGUAGE OPTIONS. FOR THE FIFTH YEAR, WE CONTINUED OUR ART-MAKING SERIES FOR TEENS.

THE MUSEUM'S COLLECTION EMBODIES THE BEST EFFORTS OF HISTORIC AND CONTEMPORARY ARTISTS TO DEPICT WILDLIFE, INCLUDING OVER 5,000 CATALOGED ITEMS SPANNING 4,000 YEARS BY APPROXIMATELY 600 ARTISTS. AS A NATIONAL COLLECTION, IT EMPHASIZES PRIME EXAMPLES OF WORK PRODUCED BY ARTISTS FROM THE NATION ITSELF, WITH A REPRESENTATIVE SELECTION OF SUBJECTS, FORMS, STYLES, MATERIALS, AND MEDIA. THE MUSEUM FOCUSES ITS COLLECTING PRACTICES WITH THE PRIMARY GOAL OF CONTINUALLY STRENGTHENING THE PERMANENT COLLECTION THROUGH STRATEGIC ACQUISITIONS, RANGING FROM MAJOR ARTWORKS TO SUPPLEMENTAL PIECES, WHICH WILL ENHANCE THE OVERALL QUALITY AS WELL AS THE DIVERSITY OF THE COLLECTION, WHILE ALSO ADDING TO ITS THEMATIC DEPTH AND BREADTH.

IF THEY DO ACT, THE FULL BOARD STILL HEARS THE ISSUE AND COULD OVERTURN THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE, THOUGH THAT IS NOT ANTICIPATED.
