**The National Museum of Wildlife Art is seeking a full-time Assistant Curator of Education**

**Description:** Full-time position working in the Museum's Education Department. The *Assistant Curator of Education* performs a variety of duties in support of Museum learning, specializing in the creation, implementation, & evaluation of educational programs for youth and adults. Youth programs, pre-k through 12<sup>th</sup> grade, occur both on and offsite and include virtual programs as well as community collaborations. Adult programs include in-gallery programming, lectures, webinars, films, performances, and art making that enrich exhibit themes. Other major responsibilities include management of our scholarship programs, assisting with the creation and installation of community art exhibits, support of the Museum's volunteer program, support of the Museum's *Bisoncast* outreach initiative, support of programming associated with the Greater Yellowstone Botanical Tour on the Museum Sculpture Trail, and oversight of the Children's Discovery Gallery. The Assistant Curator of Education works with the Sugden Chief Curator of Education and the Coordinator of Volunteer Resources to shape and promote the National Museum of Wildlife Art's mission as an educational resource.

**Requirements:** B.A. required; M.A. in Art, Education, or a related field preferred. Three years direct experience in education program management. Experience with diverse audiences and learning situations. Demonstrated creativity and experience in making art accessible through participatory programs. Spanish language skills are a major plus. Ability to keep track of details and organize large quantities of information. Must be computer literate and comfortable using Microsoft Windows/Office.
